There will be youth from at least 6 countries as well as from a majority of the states and from all over Florida learning and sharing their ideas on crime prevention. In addition to the youth, there will be law enforcement officers, youth workers, educators, and Crime Watch representatives in attendance.

The conference features over 60 workshops on crime prevention skills, preventing violence and drugs, and other key components of youth crime prevention.

There will be plenary sessions with national motivational speakers and education leaders.
