

FLORIDA NATIVE SHADE TREES

Below are some examples of Florida Native Shade Trees and Palms that may be planted in the City of Pembroke Pines. In addition to this list, there are several different types of trees also permitted for planting. Please check with your local nursery or landscape company for the names of those trees. All native shade trees need to be 10-12 feet, unless otherwise noted on your approved tree application. The Shade trees need to be replaced at 2:1 ratio. The Palms need to be a minimum of 12 feet with a 4-foot clear trunk and must be used at a 3:1 ratio if used in substitution of the required shade trees. Ex: One (1) shade tree to be removed = Two (2) shade trees to be replaced or six (6) palm trees 10' 12' overall height.
