INCIDENT SUMMARY:

Update on July 3, 2016 at 10:30 am: Members of the community recognized the suspect walking near the intersection of Red Road and Miramar Parkway, and contacted 9-1-1. Police officers from the Miramar Police Department responded since the occurrence was within the City of Miramar. Police officers identified the suspect and apprehended him without incident. Police officers from the Pembroke Pines Police Department responded to take custody of the suspect, and next transported him to the court ordered South Florida State Hospital facility. The suspect faces State Correctional System Escape charges under Florida State Statute 944.40.

Preliminary investigation suggests that the suspect was not responsible for any further criminal activity while unaccounted for. This investigation remains active, and no additional information will release at this time.
