On October 13, 2017 at approximately 3:30pm members of the Pembroke Pines Police Department responded to the above location regarding to a suspicious incident involving an adult male and a juvenile male. The initial investigation revealed that at approximately 7:15 am on today's date the juvenile was walking to his school bus stop in front of the Camden Portifino Clubhouse, and the above described subject approached him and attempted to start a conversation. The juvenile felt uncomfortable and began to walk away towards the entrance of the community. The subject briefly followed the juvenile while still attempting to make conversation.
