On Saturday, 12.16.2017, at 7:42 am, members of the Pembroke Pines Police and Fire Departments responded to a traffic crash at the intersection of University Drive and Johnson Street.

A preliminary investigation revealed Driver 1 was operating a 2009 Chrysler southbound on University Drive, approaching Johnson Street. Vehicle 2 and Vehicle 3 were both stopped southbound on University Drive, care of a red traffic signal. Vehicle 4 was stopped northbound on University Drive, also care of a red traffic signal.

Preliminary information gained by traffic investigators may suggest that Driver 1 suffered a medical complication, and then lost control of his vehicle. As a result, Vehicle 1 collided into Vehicle 2, 3, and 4. The impact of the crash caused severe damage to all vehicles.

At impact, traffic flow for eastbound and westbound Johnson Street was controlled by a green signal. Fortunately, no other traffic was affected by the crash sequence of events.

Driver 2 was not injured and refused medical attention.

Driver 4, Passenger 1, and Passenger 2 were transported to Memorial Pembroke Hospital with non-life threatening injuries.

Driver 3 was transported to Memorial Regional Hospital with non-life threatening injuries.

Driver 1 was transported to Memorial Regional Hospital with life threatening injuries.

The Pembroke Pines Police Department would like to remind our community to act safely and responsibly when driving.

Charges might be presented based upon the final outcome of the Traffic Unit's final investigation.
