INCIDENT SUMMARY:

Further investigation revealed additional surveillance video of the two suspects at a nearby McDonald's approximately ten minutes after the burglary. While inside the business, the suspects purchased items using the victim's stolen credit card.

We are asking for the public and media's continued assistance in locating these individuals. Please contact our Investigations Division at 954-431-2225 with any information.

We are asking for assistance from the community and our news media partners in identifying two suspects wanted for burglary of an occupied residence which occurred within the Cinnamon Place community on Sunday, January 21st.

At approximately 1PM an unknown 4-door silver sedan occupied by two black males (Suspect #1 and Suspect #2) parked in front of the victim's residence. The suspects proceeded to knock on the victim's

front door. The victim's son (Victim #2), who was home alone at the time of the incident, observed them through the peep hole. Not recognizing either suspect, Victim #2 did not answer the door. Both suspects then proceeded to walk to the rear of the residence and entered the home by smashing a sliding glass door.

Victim #2, in fear for his safety, went upstairs and locked himself inside of the master bedroom's closet and proceeded to contact police. Victim #2's mother (Victim #1) was able to observe the two suspects remotely on her phone via internal and external home cameras. Believing that both suspects may be friends of her son, she attempted to contact Victim #2 on his cell phone. Victim #2 was on the phone with police dispatch at this time. Both suspects ransacked the residence before breaking into the master bedroom where Victim #2 was hiding in the closet.

Officers arrived on scene within two minutes of being dispatched and established a perimeter around the residence. Both suspects fled the scene by this time. Our officers made contact with Victim #2, who was unharmed, and escorted him out of the residence.

Victim #1 was able to provide video footage of the incident to our detectives. Suspect #1 and Suspect #2 are described as black males, 5'4" to 5'7" in height, approximately 16 to 19 years old, with thin builds, short dreads, and dark complexions. Both suspects were last seen wearing black shirts, black shorts, and long white socks.
