SUSPECT(S) - NAME, AGE, DOB, RACE, SEX, ADDRESS:

- 1) Black Male, approximately 5'5" in height, thin build, early 20's, LSW dark grey hoodie, NOI
- 2) Black Male, approximately 5'6" in height, wearing glasses not shaded, NOI

VICTIM(S) - NAME, AGE, DOB, RACE, SEX, ADDRESS:

- 1) Black Female, 57 Years Old

INCIDENT SUMMARY:

On February 5, 2018 at approximately 10:30PM the victim arrived at her residence and parked her vehicle in a guest parking space. As she was exiting, she was approached by the listed suspects. The suspects demanded that she give them her bag (which they thought was a purse) and her keys. Suspect #1 pushed the victim to the ground and held a gun to her right ear. While trying to get the keys from her hands, Suspect #2 kicked the victim twice on her right thigh and struck her three times on her head with a closed fist while telling her to shut up. The victim kept pleading with them "no, no, no". Suspect #2 then entered the vehicle to burglarize it, and Suspect #1 then ripped the keys from the victim's hands. As the victim ran towards her apartment, witnesses observed the suspects running west within the community and then southbound on 86 Ave where they lost sight of them.

An extensive search of the area by police did not locate the suspects.

The victim was treated by Pembroke Pines Fire Rescue while on scene due to feeling pain, but there were no visible injuries at the time.

There have been two similar armed carjacking incidents which occurred in the Windmill Lakes community (SW 86 Avenue and SW 5th Street) in the month of December 2017 (listed below). We believe that these incidents are likely related due to similarities in the location and suspect descriptions.

We are asking residents to remain cautious as we continue to actively investigate these incidents. Always be aware of your surroundings when you are entering or exiting your vehicle, and be on the lookout for suspicious persons that may be loitering in the area before you park. If you see a suspicious person(s) please do not hesitate to call 911.

On Wednesday, December 13th, at approximately 9PM the victim was sitting inside of her vehicle which was backed into a parking space within the Windmill Lakes Apartment complex. Two unknown suspects approached the victim from her passenger and drivers-side doors, each pointing a firearm at the victim. The victim was ordered out of her vehicle and both suspects proceeded to exit the community in the victim's car (2017 Toyota Corolla, gray, last seen bearing FL tag HEYX92). The victim was not injured during this incident, and no shots were fired.

Both suspects are described as black males, approximately 5'7" in height, 170 lbs, in their late teens or early 20s.

The other incident occurred on Thursday, December 14th, at approximately 11:30PM. The victim was parked and sitting inside of her vehicle when an unknown suspect entered the car through the unlocked passenger-side door while brandishing a firearm. A second suspect, who was also armed with a firearm, approached the drivers-side door and ordered the victim out of the vehicle. Once the victim exited her vehicle a third suspect entered via the rear passenger door, and all three suspects fled in the victim's car (2011 Hyundai Sonata, silver, last seen bearing FL tag 879XJD). The victim was not injured during this incident, and no shots were fired.

All three suspects were described as black males (no other information).
