INCIDENT SUMMARY:

Update at 9:45 p.m. on 02.18.2018:

The Missing Person, Mr. Roberto Angel Perez, was located at approximately 4:45 p.m. on Sunday, 02.18.2018. He was immediately transported to an area hospital and remains in critical condition.

Mr. Perez was found in an isolated area of landscape and brush, which was aggressively searched by ground and air units over the last nine (9) days. No foul play is suspected with this investigation, and it is unknown how long Mr. Perez remained at the location found.

In an effort to safely locate Mr. Perez, the Pembroke Pines Police Department deployed every available resource and partnered with a number of law enforcement agencies, as well as various search entities. Today, the Civil Air Patrol, a volunteer branch of the United States Air Force, joined forces with the Pembroke Pines Police Department. An air and ground team was assembled and worked in concert with the Pembroke Pines Police Mobile

Update at 4:30 p.m. on 02.10.2018 / Media Conference Announced:

The Pembroke Pines Police Department will hold a media conference at 9:00 p.m. on Saturday, 02.10.2018. The police department is very concerned for the Missing Person’s well-being, and dedicated every available resource to help locate Mr. Perez.

The Missing Person has no known means of transportation, and likely walked to an area nearby.

Because of the Missing Person’s endangered condition, the police department is requesting the assistance of our media partners to share information which might help locate, and provide his safe return.

Our media partners can expect the family of the Missing Person to be available for camera interviews during the conference.

An investigation revealed the Missing Person is considered endangered and suffers from Alzheimer's. The Missing Person was last seen walking from his residence at approximately 6:30 a.m. this morning. He was last seen wearing a blue and white checkered shirt, brown pants and red and black sandals. The Missing Person is of thin build and has thinning grey hair only around the sides of his head.

Mr. Perez has been reported missing several times in the past, and previously located walking throughout Century Village community.

Due to the Missing Person's age and condition of health, the Pembroke Pines Police Department seeks the media's assistance in broadcasting this information. An image of the Missing Person is also attached for media distribution.
