## **INCIDENT SUMMARY:**

At 4:10 p.m. on Sunday, June 02, 2019, members of the Pembroke Pines Police Department responded to a shots fired incident located at the Pembroke Lakes Mall parking lot.

A preliminary investigation revealed that both victims properly parked their vehicles next to one another, and were having a conversation within the mall parking lot.

The suspect drove his vehicle within the same access aisle, and argued with the male victim over a parking space. The suspect fired shots at the male victim's vehicle, shattering the rear window, and then fled toward Flamingo Road.

The female victim immediately drove her own vehicle away from the parking lot. Soon after, the female victim realized that the suspect was following, when she noticed additional shots fired near the intersection of NW 4th Street and Flamingo Road.

Responding police officers observed the suspect driving northbound on Flamingo Road and pursued his vehicle.

At the intersection of Flamingo Road and Sheridan Street, the suspect discharged his firearm numerous times, toward pursuing police officers, who returned fire.

The suspect next drove westbound on Sheridan Street at a high rate of speed. He lost control and drove down an embankment near the 13800 block of Sheridan Street, then ultimately crashed into undeveloped and dense landscape.

Officers were able to observe the armed suspect, however he was unwilling to surrender. Eventually, responding members of the Pembroke Pines SWAT Team safely placed the suspect into custody with the use of a less lethal weapon. He was then transported to Memorial Hospital West with minor injuries, likely sustained during the traffic crash.

Thankfully, no Pembroke Pines Police Officers or any civilian victims were physically injured during this violent incident.

The Broward Sheriff's Office is investigating the officer involved shooting aspect of this incident.

Additional investigative developments revealed earlier this day, at approximately 3:59 p.m., the suspect committed an aggravated assault in the City of Miramar. In that incident, a female victim approached the suspect's vehicle within the Monarch Lakes residential community. The suspect pointed his firearm at the victim, as he drove slowly through her neighborhood. The Miramar Police Department case number is 19-06-003555.

The Pembroke Pines Police Department investigation remains active, and we are asking the public to provide any information which might be helpful in solving this case.
