INCIDENT SUMMARY:

At approximately 11:52 p.m. on Monday, July 22, 2019, the Pembroke Pines Police Department was contacted by Broward School Board Security regarding an in-progress burglary that was occurring at Charles W. Flanagan High School (12800 Taft Street). Multiple masked or hooded suspects were observed by school security via live surveillance feeds.

When officers arrived, the suspects were seen running through the halls and courtyard area of the

school. Upon observing the responding officers, all nine suspects fled from the school campus and crossed over into C.B. Smith Park (900 N Flamingo Road). All nine suspects refused to comply with lawful commands, and continued to flee and hide within the park for an extended period of time. A perimeter was established around the area, and assistance was requested by Pembroke Pines Police K-9, Miramar Police K-9 Unit, as well as a BSO Aviation Unit. Officers were able to safely locate all nine suspects, who were attempting to avoid arrest by hiding in the woods or swimming across the lake.

Our subsequent investigation revealed that the suspects had entered the school campus by jumping a fence, whereupon they gained access to the school cafeteria and at least one classroom.

All nine suspects face charges of Burglary, Trespassing on School Grounds, and Resisting Arrest Without Violence.
