A Pembroke Pines Police School Resource Officer has been transported to the hospital after being struck by a vehicle in front of Charles W. Flanagan High School (12800 Taft Street).

Earlier this morning, one of our School Resource Officers assigned to Flanagan High School was directing traffic in the school zone along Taft Street. The officer was in uniform, and wearing a bright yellow traffic vest. The officer's patrol vehicle was nearby with the emergency lights activated.

At approximately 7:29 a.m. a vehicle driven by an adult female struck our officer, who sustained non-life threatening injuries and was transported to Memorial Regional Hospital for assessment. The driver was uninjured, and remained on scene.

Portions of eastbound Taft Street were temporarily shut down as our Traffic Unit conducted their investigation. The roadways have since been reopened.
