INCIDENT SUMMARY:

In an effort to increase roadway safety throughout the city, the Pembroke Pines Police Department will be participating in a High Visibility Enforcement (HVE) campaign to promote pedestrian and bicycle safety beginning December 2024 through May 9, 2025.

This campaign is funded through a contract with the University of North Florida's Institute of Police Technology and Management, in partnership with the Florida Department of Transportation's focused initiative to improve pedestrian and bicycle safety.

The goal of this enforcement effort is to increase awareness of traffic laws that protect the safety of pedestrians and bicyclists, and to ensure that all roadway users are following these laws.

Enforcement efforts will primarily focus on educating drivers, pedestrians, and bicyclists along intersections and roadways, but violators may still receive warnings or citations depending upon the circumstances. Traffic citations, if issued, will carry fines ranging from \$64.50 to \$264.00.
