



Interventionist (Teacher)

Position Description

The intervention support teacher serves as a liaison between children, parents and teachers in order to help provide the best education possible.

- Assesses students and groups of students using various diagnostic test results to help determine student needs
- provides interventions in reading, mathematics, writing, behavior and social/emotional support to students who are struggling
- Responsible for push-in and pull out support in planning instruction and/or adaptation of the instructional program using the Response to Intervention (RtI) model to facilitate student learning in accordance with system policies and state guidelines.
- Supports the instructional programs with regular teachers.
- Uses data, such as progress reports and areas of trouble, to provide instruction to students and bring their skills up to grade-level and to communicate the data with parents and teachers
- Evaluate and measure the effectiveness of specific RtI strategies and interventions in order to refine Tier 1, Tier 2, and Tier 3 levels of support.
- Prepares intervention reports for parents, teachers and principals regularly
- Serves as liaison between general education curriculum and ESE support services
- Other duties as assigned
