**UTILITY RATES**

**MINIMUM MONTHLY CHARGES**

As per City Ordinance #641, all Utility accounts must be billed for minimum monthly charges. These charges are for operation and maintenance of the system and therefore, must be billed to all accounts regardless of whether the premises are occupied or vacant (including vacation). This bill will be sent to the customer of record at the service address unless account holder has given written notification for a different mailing address.
